Ohio Options for Adults: Aspire and Adult Diploma Program

Ohio Options programs offer free classes for adults who need help acquiring the skills to be successful in college, training or employment.

Aspire

The Aspire program offers classes to help adult students:

- · Improve their academic skills
- · Prepare for the workforce
- · Prepare for the High School Equivalency (HSE) test
- · Prepare to earn a high school diploma
- · Improve their English skills (ELL/ESOL)
- · Prepare for a job, college or training

Morning and evening classes take place at Tri-C's Eastern, Metropolitan, Western and Westshore campuses, at Corporate College® West in Westlake and at other locations throughout Cuyahoga County. The program is for students ages 16 and older whose skills are below a 12thgrade level. Orientation is required.

Adult Diploma Program

The Adult Diploma Program offers an opportunity for adults ages 20 and older to earn a high school diploma. The program includes:

- · Career advisement
- · National career readiness certificate
- · Certification for an in-demand career in health care, manufacturing, logistics or construction

Students must complete an Ohio Options orientation session before enrolling in the Adult Diploma Program. During orientation, you'll be assessed to determine if you meet program requirements. If your scores need improvement, you will enter Aspire classes until your assessment scores qualify for the Adult Diploma Program.

Interfaith Community Service Initiative

Educational Opportunity Center (EOC)

The Educational Opportunity Center is a federally-funded TRIO program that offers free enrollment assistance to more than 1,200 Cuyahoga County adults annually. The program is open to individuals ages 18 and over who wish to further their education. EOC advisors provide information, workshops and services to individuals and groups.

Advisors help participants:

- · Enroll in college, certificate or vocational training programs
- Enroll in Ohio Options for Adults (Aspire/GED or Adult Diploma)
- · Learn about academic and career opportunities
- · Obtain college admissions information
- · Address student loan defaults
- · Apply for federal student aid and scholarships

Women in Transition (WIT)

The Women in Transition Program is a non-credit course that is available at no cost to the participant. The curriculum is designed to help women move their lives forward as they create personalized plans focused on academic and professional development. Upon completion, participants are equipped to continue their education, enter the workforce, understand financial aid options and identify marketable skills and career opportunities.
