The Associate of Arts in Art History is based on the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway in Art History. It is recommended for students planning to start at Tri-C and transfer to a four-year institution to major in Art

There are a variety of art history-related careers in museum, gallery, conservation, art auction, nonprofit and academic settings. Some of the many potential careers in the field of Art History include Art Historian, Art Curator, Museum Administrator/Director, Art Authenticator, Art Librarian/ Visual Resource Curator, Teacher, and Art Publishing.

- 1. Demonstrate visual analysis and visual literacy through close looking exercises, comparative analysis, oral and/or written communication.
- 2. Analyze how works of art function as visual language throughout history with an emphasis on cultural context.
- 3. Examine art historical and visual evidence through attribution, provenance, authenticity, and original context.
- 4. Apply critical and creative thinking to the interpretation and analysis of works of art from around the world to explain how events and objects from the past relate to contemporary society.
- 5. Research and develop interpretations and analyses of artworks from various cultures around the world using a range of specific artistic and scholarly examples and references.
- 6. Be prepared for transfer to four-year Bachelor of Arts program in Art History.

MATH-1140, MATH-1141, MATH-1200, MATH-1270, and MATH-1280 can no longer count towards fulfilling the college-level mathematics requirement. These courses were re-classified as developmental mathematics by the state of Ohio in 2016. Tri-C established a 5-year transitioning window for students who had completed these courses prior to 2016 to apply them towards meeting graduation requirements, which expired in Summer 2021. It is highly recommended to see a counselor to determine the appropriate math required for your current major.
