

# ASSOCIATE OF ARTS WITH A CONCENTRATION IN SOCIOLOGY



The Associate of Arts degree with a concentration in Sociology is based on the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway in Sociology. It is recommended for students planning to start at Tri-C and transfer to a four-year institution to major in Sociology.

A four-year degree in Sociology can prepare you for a variety of careers in a number of industries including business, social service, private non-profit sector, and government service. A Sociology degree also serves as a strong foundation for students planning to go on to graduate studies in Sociology, Social Work, Counseling, or to pursue a law degree.

The Associate of Arts degree with a concentration in Sociology will provide students with a foundation in sociological theories, communication, and critical thinking skills, which will prepare them to succeed upon transferring to a four-year institution.

- Eligibility to enroll in MATH-1410 Elementary Probability and Statistics I

## Program Outcomes

1. Apply the major sociological theories and concepts to analyze social phenomena at the macro- and micro-level.
2. Explain how intersectionality of statuses such as race, class, gender, and family of origin can impact achievements and experiences of an individual.
3. Analyze sociological research to examine social issues and complex societal problems.
4. Explain how globalization is impacting US society.
5. Use critical thinking skills to analyze situations, adapt to changes, and resolve problems.
6. Communicate effectively in spoken and written English, for an intended audience, using clear, organized language.

MATH-1140, MATH-1141, MATH-1200, MATH-1270, and MATH-1280 can no longer count towards fulfilling the college-level mathematics requirement. These courses were re-classified as developmental mathematics by the state of Ohio in 2016. Tri-C established a 5-year transitioning window for students who had completed these courses

prior to 2016 to apply them towards meeting graduation requirements, which expired in Summer 2021. It is highly recommended to see a counselor to determine the appropriate math required for your current major.

## Foreign Language Requirement

The majority of schools require at least 6-8 credits of foreign language at the College level to complete a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology; however, the Foreign Language requirement varies from institution to institution and may depend on how many foreign language courses you took at the high school level. For this reason, you should check with your intended transfer institution to determine how many foreign language credits are required for your intended transfer program and plan accordingly. To fulfill foreign language requirements, you should select from the below Transfer Assurance Guide approved foreign language courses. If your intended program of study doesn't require foreign language or you have fulfilled the requirement based on coursework taken in high school, you may select other appropriate Ohio Transfer Module or Transfer Assurance Guide approved courses as electives, in place of the foreign language requirement. See recommendations below for elective course selection.

Note, if your transfer school requires more than 6-8 credits of foreign language, you can apply those credits towards the elective requirement or take the additional coursework at your four year institution.
