

ASSOCIATE OF ARTS WITH A CONCENTRATION IN STUDIO/FINE ARTS



The Associate of Arts in Studio/Fine Arts is based on the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway in Studio/Fine Arts. It is recommended for students planning to start at Tri-C and transfer to a four-year institution to major in Studio/Fine Arts.

The Art program at Tri-C connects students with top-notch faculty and working professional artists who can help them achieve their creative goals and grow as artists.

There are a variety of art-related careers in commercial, nonprofit and government settings. Some of the many potential careers in the Arts include: Fine Artist (Ceramicist, Painter, Printmaker, Photographer, etc.), Art Teacher, Art Historian, Art Curator, Art Preparator/Handler, Art Therapist, Arts Administrator, Art Director, Art Critic/Writer, Museum Technician, Textile/Fabric Artist or Designer, Muralist, and many more!

1. Demonstrate competency working with foundational skills in drawing, 2D design, and 3D design.
2. Use foundational concepts to visually demonstrate an understanding of the processes and materials involved in the creation of artwork in a variety of media.
3. Apply art making skills to solve visual problems, communicate concepts, and develop personal expression.
4. Examine the visual arts within past and present historical contexts.
5. Apply oral and written skills to critically evaluate and analyze artwork.
6. Apply critical thinking skills to constructively evaluate one's own artwork, the work of peers, and the artworks of historical and contemporary artists.
7. Be prepared for transfer to four-year Bachelor of Arts program in Studio Fine Arts.

MATH-1140, MATH-1141, MATH-1200, MATH-1270, and MATH-1280 can no longer count towards fulfilling the college-level mathematics requirement. These courses were re-classified as developmental mathematics by the state of Ohio in 2016. Tri-C established a 5-year transitioning window for students who had completed these courses prior to 2016 to apply them towards meeting graduation requirements, which expired in Summer 2021. It is highly recommended to see a counselor to determine the appropriate math required for your current major.

Foreign Language Requirement

To fulfill foreign language requirements, you should select from the below Transfer Assurance Guide approved foreign language courses.

If your intended program of study doesn't require foreign language or you have fulfilled the requirement based on coursework taken in high school, you may select other appropriate Ohio Transfer 36 or Transfer Assurance Guide approved courses as electives, in place of the foreign language requirement. See recommendations above for studio art elective selection.
