Program description

The Firefighter I and II certification program prepares individuals for entry-level positions in the exciting career of professional firefighting. Training includes topics related to the requirements established by the Ohio Revised Code for Career Firefighters and the training and educational requirements identified in NFPA 1001. More than 150 students participate in the program each year.

The Fire Training Academy offers the following scheduling options:

- 7-week daytime academy
- 10-week daytime academy
- 17-week evening academy

With a student passage rate of 99%, Tri-C's Fire Training Academy is one of the largest and most respected programs in Ohio. Students who complete the Firefighter I and II training program earn 13 credits toward an Associate of Applied Science degree in Fire-Emergency Medical Services.

Upon completion, students receive:

- Certification in Hazardous Materials/WMD – Awareness and Operation Levels
- State of Ohio Practical Skills Certification

Students take the Ohio Firefighter I and II certification exams upon completion.
